(Research online to find out more) 2. What biological reasons are given explain why girls out-perform boys in some subjects? 3. What social reasons are given to explain why girls out-perform boys? (Social reasons are factors in a person’s environment that might shape their beliefs, attitudes and behaviour). 4. Add any ideas that you hadn’t already thought of, to the mind map you make for task 0.1, using a different colour. 	from 14 th September 2020
All	Sociological research	0.3 Carry out your own Sociological research Read the information on slides 16-21 about sociological research methods. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Design a written questionnaire to investigate differences in how boys and girls studied in year 11, and how much revision they did Find out about their attitudes to school, learning and exams. 2. Carry out your questionnaire with a sample of 5 boys and 5 girls who have just completed year 11. 	from 14 th September 2020
All	Report writing	0.4 Research report Write up your investigation. This can be done as a power-point of not more than 6 slides, or as a typed report of not more than 500-750. (See guidance on slide 25).	from 14 th September 2020
Extension	Higher order thinking	0.5 Evaluate the nature/nurture debate Which is more powerful nature or nurture? Write a paragraph in response to this question
